Loss of Privileges

“Loss of privilege” means that students may not attend and/or participate in extracurricular school activities on or off campus before, during, or after school.

Events include:

- Assemblies, Field Trips, Games (Playing/Attending), Contests, Spirit Dress, Dances, Extended Day, Pep Rallies, Concerts, Productions, etc...

How does a student get onto the loss of privileges list?

Only certain triggers would move a student to the “LOP list”.

1. Unpaid fines and fees
2. 15 tardies in a given semester
3. 3 dress code violations that resulted in an office referral
4. 3 cell phone violations
5. 5 classroom incidents from an individual teacher. This would require documentation of parent contact and a review of the incidents by the administrative staff before the LOP placement.
6. 3 days in the Hold
7. 1 suspension in a given semester
8. Students who fail a class and are enrolled in e2020
9. Other reasons deemed appropriate by school administration

How does a student get off of the loss of privileges list?

Students will regain their privileges after they maintain 3 weeks of good behavior.

For example, if tardies placed the student on the LOP list, they will only be eligible if they do not get any tardies for 3 weeks.

However, the 3 weeks of good behavior will not automatically reinstate a student’s school privileges. Once a student is eligible, they will reapply for privileges in the front office and seek administrator approval. Forms will be located in the front office.

There are primary exceptions to the three week rule. First, students who lose privileges based on unpaid fines and fees will be removed once the fine is paid. Second, students that finish their requirements in e2020 will be removed as well. Suspensions and alternative education placements will supersede any eligibility rights. Students who have been suspended will only be allowed to regain their privileges for an extended amount of time (6 weeks, semester, etc...). Anything that warranted an AEC or JJAEP placement will result in no regaining of school privileges.
