GISD FALL 2020 INTERSESSION HANDBOOK



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Intersession Purpose

When exploring calendar options, there were several key considerations that guided the district's work to include Intersessions:

- addressing the traditional **summer slide**, which represents the typical decline in student achievement observed during summer breaks and responding to the anticipated long-term impact of **COVID-19**
- providing strategic Intervention, Enrichment and Acceleration opportunities that are built into the school year to provide timely student support and flexibility to respond to student needs

Our new 2020-2021 calendar was approved by the Board of Trustees on June 23rd and it included three Intersessions. Our mission as a district is to create Intersessions to be effective and engaging learning opportunities for students.

Garland ISD will hold fall, spring and summer Intersessions throughout the school year to provide support to improve the academic achievement for all students. The academic focus will be on intervention, acceleration, and enrichment activities to respond to student needs and sustain learning.

Intersessions must be targeted and intentional; therefore, campuses will analyze data to determine which sessions students will be invited to attend. Students are encouraged to attend Intersessions for the purpose of:

- Intervention based on skill deficits identified by a universal screener, standardized test results, formative assessments or cycle/course failures
- Accelerations in order to elevate a student's proficiency level on assessments, boost course credit acquisition, and/or prepare for college readiness assessment prep
- Enrichment through curriculum extension including camps

Once students have confirmed attendance, teachers will utilize individual student data to create specific lessons that target academic needs. Intersessions are strategically scheduled to provide intervention, enrichment, and accelerations following a grading cycle, rather than delaying these experiences until the summer. For intervention, the ability to provide students with these more immediate recovery opportunities will reduce the likelihood of compounding knowledge gaps when new grade level content is presented and students do not possess the requisite skills.

Intersession Details

Each campus will develop their own Intersession offerings, which must include intervention, and should include options for Enrichment and Acceleration. The district will provide specialized offerings located at "Hub" campuses. The instructional model for Intersession will mimic the mode of instruction occurring for the week prior to Intersession (i.e, Virtual, F2F, etc). The student to teacher ratio is 15:1. Students will attend for four hours each day with breakfast and lunch provided. Transportation will be provided for all eligible participating students.

- The district is expecting 25% of students to attend the Fall Intersession; however, we will accommodate any student that commits to attend. Please note: certain enrichment/acceleration sessions have a cap on attendance and will fill quickly.

Planning and Curriculum

Teachers will plan and prepare for Intersessions during PLC time. It is crucial for all stakeholders to be a part of the planning and preparation in order to meet the needs of all students. In the weeks prior to Intersession, teachers, alongside their administrative team, will analyze data to develop individualized instruction for all students attending intervention sessions. Leadership should incorporate time during PLC to allow for communication between the Intersession teachers and all grade level teachers.

For Intervention sessions, the curriculum coordinators will develop grade level lessons and activities based on high leverage TEKS from the previous cycle so teachers can reteach. Also, there will be lessons and activities for a foundation that gives students confidence in moving into the new cycle.

Staffing

To ensure the students in GISD are getting the help and support they need, it is important to hire the best of the best staff for Intersession weeks. RAAD will provide you with prior year teacher performance data. If you have questions reach out to your Area Director, RAAD, or Intervention Department for support.

Plan to Actively Engage Students Who Do Not Attend Intersession
