Air Force Junior ROTC

Early College High School (ECHS)

- Earn up to 60 college hours or an Associate of Arts degree.
- Special electives offered in drama and social sciences.
- Cohort groups foster accelerated learning and provide support to develop academic and social skills necessary for college completion in a “school within a school” environment.
- Degree offered through Dallas College Eastfield Campus.
- Students may still participate in athletics, visual and performing arts, and extracurricular activities.

No testing or grading requirements necessary.

Pathways in Technology Early College High School (P-TECH)

- Associate of Applied Science in interactive simulation and game technology
- Associate of Applied Science in software programming and developing
- Associate of Science
- Earn up to 60 college hours or a degree.
