Teaching Experience:

Lakeview Centennial High School 2011-current
Instructor Introduction to Sociology (regulars) – This course is a basic high school level introduction to sociology which includes the instruction of the Texas High School Standards outlined by the (TEKS)
Students learn basic social theory, history of sociology, cultural influences of social construction, social stratification, race, gender and economic influences of society among other current topics.

Instructor Introduction to Sociology (Dual Credit) – This course is guided not only by the High School Curriculum Standards but the Dallas County Community College District Guidelines as well. Students are instructed in the same fashion as their traditional college peers but within the high school setting. All course objective mirror that of the university and all guidelines are the same as the standard 1301 Level Introduction to Sociology course.

Instructor Health Science and Technology (Principles of Health Science)

Course is designed to offer students an introduction to health sciences and careers falling under the health science label. The students obtain an overview of current trends in health care careers, the body functions and requirements and obligations of a healthcare worker.

Instructor Health Science and Technology (Introduction to Health Systems)

Course designed to offer students a hands on experience regarding health care. The students are trained in the areas of pathophysiology, pharmacology, anatomy, clinical skills, First Aide, basic life support. The students rotate through a clinical/hospital setting to obtain vocational experience regarding their career paths.

Instructor Health Science and Technology (Dual Credit)

Course is same as above with a dual credit component that adheres to the guidelines of El Centro College to fulfill the Introduction to Health Management systems level 1301 course offered by the Dallas County Community College District.

Forensic Science
